

§ 1 Name, registered office and financial year

1. The association bears the name "Julian Assange Archive e.V."
2. Its registered office is located at Köthener Straße 70, 06844 Dessau-Roßlau.
3. The financial year corresponds to the calendar year.

§ 2 Purpose

1. The purpose of the association is to promote art and culture, political education, human rights, science and research, and to provide support for prisoners.
2. The association pursues exclusively and directly charitable purposes within the meaning of the section "tax-privileged purposes" of the German Tax Code.
3. The association is non-partisan and not profit-oriented.

§ 3

The following measures in particular shall be carried out to fulfil the purpose of the association:

- a) Collecting, preserving, researching and disseminating materials and documents related to Julian Assange and the global movement for press freedom, transparency, democracy and human rights.
- b) Promoting political education and public awareness of press freedom, transparency, democratic participation and human rights through exhibitions, lectures, educational programmes, workshops and digital offerings.
- c) Supporting and promoting young people, especially young prisoners, through artistic workshops with the aim of facilitating their reintegration into society and strengthening their civic engagement.
- d) Supporting grassroots movements and grassroots democratic initiatives through educational programmes, workshops and advice on setting up campaigns, networks and sustainable structures for effective protest and social engagement.
- e) Promoting international understanding, peaceful coexistence and respect for human rights through education and information work.

§ 4 Non-profit status

1. The association acts selflessly and does not primarily pursue its own economic interests.
2. The association's funds may only be used for purposes in accordance with its statutes.
3. Members do not receive any payments from the association's funds.
4. Necessary expenses incurred by members or board members in the course of their work for the association may be reimbursed from the association's funds.
5. Anyone working for the association may receive appropriate lump-sum remuneration.
6. No person may be favoured by expenses that are not related to the purpose of the association or by disproportionately high remuneration.

§ 5 Membership

1. Any natural or legal person who supports the purpose of the association may become a member. The application for membership must be made in writing. Minors also require the consent of a parent or guardian for admission.
2. A distinction is made between **full members** with voting rights and **supporting members** without voting rights.
3. The Executive Board decides on admission. In the event of rejection of a membership application, the applicant has the right to appeal against the rejection. This must be done in writing and must state the reasons for the appeal. The appeal will be decided at an extraordinary General Meeting.
4. Membership ends through resignation, expulsion or death. Resignation must be declared in writing to the Executive Board.
5. Supporting members support the association ideologically and/or financially and are invited to all events, but do not participate in voting.

§ 6 Organs of the association

The organs of the association are:

1. The existing general meeting.
2. The executive committee.

§ 7 General meeting

1. The general meeting is the highest decision-making body and consists of ordinary members.
The duly convened general meeting is always quorate.
2. It meets at least once a year.
3. Resolutions are passed by a two-thirds majority.

§ 8 Executive

1. The Executive Board consists of at least two persons
2. It represents the association in and out of court.

3. The term of office is two years.

§ 9 Dissolution of the association

In the event of dissolution of the association or discontinuation of tax-privileged purposes, the association's assets shall fall to a legal entity under public law or another tax-privileged entity for the purpose of supporting young prisoners and their reintegration into civil society.

§ 10 Membership fees

1. The membership fees shall be determined by the general meeting.

2. All contributions shall be used exclusively for the realisation of the purposes set out in the statutes. These statutes shall enter into force upon entry in the register of associations.
